Who does the mentoring program serve?

MET serves students, primarily ninth graders, from University City High School Philadelphia.

What is the goal of the program?

The goal of the program is to help teens successfully transition into a high school by providing a stable, supportive relationship with an adult mentor.

How can I become a mentor?

All MET, Inc. Mentors must meet the following criteria:

- Be an adult at least 21 years of age
- Commit to building a five hour a month relationship with a student
- Complete the mentor application
- An interview with a staff member
- Pass a background and clearance check
- Attend initial mentor orientation and training
- Participate in a minimum of two ongoing training sessions per year.

When and where do mentors and mentees meet?

Mentors and mentees meet in person once a week.

What do mentors and mentees do together?

Mentors and mentees spend their time together in a variety of ways including; sports, education and participation and community service in activities, museums, movies, and just talking together.
